This course first addresses the nature, functional principles, and process of NEA cooperation. It will contain four main parts: 1) Explore basic concepts, history, and current issues relevant to the formation of NEA community; 2) discuss the role, current development with economic and security cooperation with North Korea and challenges of bringing North Korea into NEA community; 3) introduce multilateral security and economic cooperation mechanisms such as Six Party Talks, ASEAN-plus-3, and Shanghai Cooperation Organization; and 4) main actors' responses and policies toward the NEA community and North Korea. There will be 12 lecturers in total, who are leading scholars and practitioners in the field, including former ministers of foreign affairs, professors, and researchers for state institutions for inter-Korean economic cooperation.

This course will be offered one semester with a focus on North Korea for the Northeast Asian community building. As aforementioned, the plan of this course over the year would be to cover the key concepts, historical background, and current issues of NEA community building and enhance understanding of multilateral security and economic cooperation in NEA and stimulate the process of regional integration through invited lecturers from government and academic institutions
