SYLLABUS 3 (3-0-6)
ASIAN COMMUNITY AND ASEAN

Prerequisite: None

PURPOSE:

This is a new omnibus lecture series in English on "Asian Community and ASEAN" and its influence on Thailand. ASEAN started its AEC (Asean Economic Community) in 2015. The trade will be liberalized in ASEAN, but at the same time some inward-looking tendencies are also observed when the world economy is slowing down. We should basically keep outward-looking policies because it is the AEC's goal. Also, we have to consider political, social, traditional, cultural and historical aspects in the region because globalization will always deeply affect these factors. The lecturers will explain present and future perspectives of the Asian communities and, they will write a textbook for the same future classes based on their lectures.

This course is mainly for under-graduate students of iMTM (International Modern Trade Management) in PIM. But other specialties can take this course.
